Paul was in house arrest for two years (Acts 28:16, 30) in 59-61/62. Later he was arrested again and placed in the Mamertime (II Tim 4:6-8). 67-68. During this time he wrote II Timothy.

3. Four churches claim connections to the NT.

i. The Church of St. Peter in the Vatican man hold metrics the body of the apostle.

- ii. The Church of St. Clement is built over the house of St. Clement. Irenaeus stated Peter and Paul founded the church in Rome, which later came under the leadership of Linus, Anacletus, and Clement.
- iii. The Church of St. Pudenziana, which is over the house of Pudens (II Tim 4:21). Tradition claims he was a believer, and possibly a Roman senator.
- iv. Another church, The Church of St. Paul Outside the Walls, claims to have the grave site of St. Paul. It is situated in a pagan cemetary that is in a flood plain.

## Paul's Journey to Rome:

- 1. Jerusalem
- 2. Caesarea
- 3. Sidon (and Tyre)
  - a. One of Herod's cities that he rebuilt outside of Judea.
  - Jesus visited Sidon (Matt 15:21-28; Mk 7:24-30) and healed the child of a Gentile woman.
  - c. No discoveries from the NT era have been found.
  - d. Paul was permitted to visit his friends there on the way to Rome (Acts 27:1, 3).
- 4. Antioch
  - a. Another city outside of Judea rebuilt by Herod.
