- b. There has been little found relative to the NT era. However, a corpus of ancient literature has been discovered relative to the city and its people. It is the home of the "Silver Chalice of Antiochy" discovered in 1910, dated to be between the 2nd and 6th centuries. Wolld Supposed Holy Gran
- c. It was a city of international commerce and athletic events, including the Olympic games.
- d. Here was the first Gentile church founded. An ideal location to serve as a springboard to spread the gospel to other nations.

## 5. Tarsus

- a. A city of Roman military station and commerce.
- b. Birthplace of Paul. A center for education, medicine, and Stoic philosophy. The ancient areas remain buried to date.

- a. Known only as a center of grain trade.
