THE VERSE OF THE THRONE

"God! there is no God but he; the living, the Eternal. Slumber doth not overtake him, neither sleep.

- To him belongeth whatsoever is in heaven and on the earth.

The great bulk of the Koran consists of ceremonial laws and stories. The stories of the Koran go back to Adam and the patriarchs, take in several unknown Arabian prophets or leaders, tell of Jesus Christ, Moses, and Solomon, but do not venture beyond Jewish territory, except to mention Alexander the Great and Lokman, who is identified with Æsop!

The Koran has many historical errors; it contains monstrous fables; it teaches a false cosmogony; it is full of superstitions; it perpetuates slavery, polygamy, divorce, religious intolerance, the seclusion and degradation of women, and it
