To begin with Africa, where Islam has cov- Islam in ered the largest area in its conquest and missionary propaganda, the stronghold of Mohammedanism lies along the Mediterranean. of twenty degrees latitude the Moslems constitute ninety-one per cent. of the total population. Thirty-three per cent. of Africa's entire population is Mohammedan, or about fifty million souls out of the whole number, one hundred and fifty millions. South of the equator there are already over four million Mohammedans and in the Congo Free State there are said to be nearly two millions.
